

Textured Landscapes

Texture is the way something feels or looks like it might feel if touched.

Texture used in art can either be **Real Texture** or **Implied Texture**.

Real Texture is a surface texture that can actually be felt. Real texture is used by artists in sculpture, fashion design, textile design, and even through built up paint on paintings.

Implied Texture is texture that the eyes see only. This type of texture is drawn or created through patterns. Textures to the right are implied textures created through line drawings to suggest the way those items would feel if touched.

Add Implied Texture by filling each space with a different texture pattern in a different color. Use the images below as inspiration but please do not copy! Make your own landscape and textures!

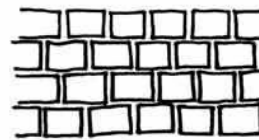

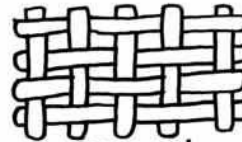

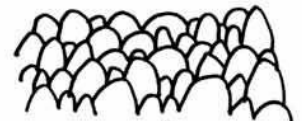

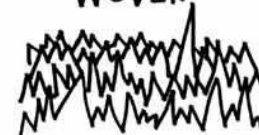

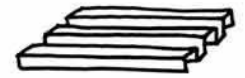
